The School

Lincoln High School is a comprehensive public school, which includes grades 9-12. Lincoln High School offers a choice-filled curriculum tailored to a wide spectrum of students.

The Community

Lincoln is a suburban town of 22,529 (2020 Census) located about 10 miles north of Providence. The town has a total area of 18.9 square miles. Lincoln is primarily a residential community for metropolitan Providence. Very recently, the town was ranked #63 in Money Magazine's "Best Places to Live". Lincoln possesses its share of several large business and manufacturing establishments. The estimated family income is 13.0% higher than the Rhode Island median family income.

The Curriculum

Lincoln High School offers approximately 200 courses. The curriculum includes a broad range of courses in Art, Business Education, Computer Science, Family and Consumer Science, Music, Technology Education, and Theatre as well as elective courses in all of the basic academic areas. Reading and Special Education programs are available. Early admission to college, concurrent enrollment, independent study, and attendance at the regional vocational school are available to students.

Lincoln High School's rigorous college preparatory curriculum provides students with the opportunity to achieve in all disciplines. Students' schedules are comprised of seven courses. On a daily basis five courses meet for sixty minute periods.

Our curriculum and programs are designed:

- To accommodate students that learn at different rates. Students will be exposed to a variety of instructional approaches and materials.
- To accommodate students who learn at a relatively slower rate, instruction in the basic skills will be in classes that have more individualized instruction.
- To accommodate students who quickly grasp concrete and abstract concepts. Accelerated courses which are noted for their rigor and high academic expectations are offered. Students are expected to work more independently in these courses.

GPA

The grade point average (GPA) is based on the unweighted average of grades in all courses taken at Lincoln High School using a 4.0 scale for grades A-U.

Class Rank

The cumulative, weighted rank includes all the courses taken by a student as compared to all other students in the graduating class. Weighting is based on course levels (College Preparatory, Honors, etc.). The weighted values vary due to the leveling: Advanced Placement (AP) are weighted a 5, Honors Courses are weighted a 4, College Preparatory are weighted a 3, and all other classes are weighted a 2.

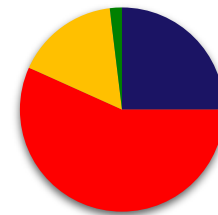
