Students will take a 25-question multiple choice assessment that is designed to assess students' comprehension of the chosen summer reading book. This summer reading assessment will count as a double-quiz grade and will occur within the first two weeks of school.

Step 1

Install the Sora app from the <u>Apple App Store</u> or <u>Google Play Store</u>, or go to the <u>Sora site online</u>.

Step 2

In Sora sign in with your student ID number. If you have to choose a school, click on RISOCKS and then select Lincoln Senior High School.

Step 3

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Browse the Explore tab and borrow a book. Your book will open so you can start reading right away.

Step 4



Close the book and go to Shelf to see all your books (including assignments). From there, you can:

- Select Open book or Open audiobook to read or listen to the book.
- Select **Options** to renew or return the book, see your notes and highlights, and more.
