- 3. Complete the Rhetorical Analysis on p. 57-58, labeled "Designing a Rhetorical Analysis".

*Be sure to read the process Designing a Rhetorical Analysis #1-6 to be sure you have evidence of each of these steps.

*Choose a multimodal text that has enough information for you to analyze all aspects of it in Ch.2. Choose well so you have an opportunity for ample and appropriate analysis.

*Be sure to include all the elements in #2: Audience, Purpose, Context, Design Choices (The definitions of these are in Ch.2)

*Create a MULTI-MODAL Rhetorical analysis of your text using **multiple modes** as discussed in Ch.1 to communicate your Rhetorical Analysis.

*Review the model / example of a Rhetorical Analysis is on pp.51-56.
